Progress being made on Payneville Extension Three

Construction has finally started at Payneville Extension Three, promising the residents of Gugulethu and Everest informal settlements a brighter future.

The metro's 2014 plans to build low-cost housing in the area have finally materialised.

Metro spokesman Themba Gadebe says phase one started in January and will be completed at the end of October.

Phase one consists of the repairs on remedial work on the existing water and sanitation infrastructure, which has been in place for the past three years, as well as the construction of roads and storm water infrastructure.

"This will be implemented during the 2016/2017 and 2017/2018 financial years," says Gadebe.

Phase two will include the construction of the subsidised houses and is projected to be completed during the 2018/2019 financial year.

Gadebe says 1 097 houses, each 40 square metres, will be built, and they will be fitted with toilets.

Siyabonga Ngwenya, community liaison officer, says the community can finally see light at the end of the

construction has started and look forward to the low-cost houses," he

Ward councillor Dean Stone says the start of construction means "we are moving in the right direction".

The plan was for the metro to construct toilets and then move the residents from Gugulethu and Everest to the area, but still staying

"I'm glad that this is no longer the case, as I understand that residents will only be moved there after the RDP houses have been built," he

The beneficiaries are residents from Gugulethu and Everest who submitted their names for the RDP development.

Stone says the current contractor was appointed to break down the old toilets and to construct infrastructure such as roads and storm water drains.

Thabo Matseba, site construction manager, says they were supposed to start with construction in 2016, but due to protests they had to postpone the construction date.

They demolished the existing toilets and started construction in January.

"Excavation of the roads started and all roads will have kap inlets, better known as storm water drains," he says.

He says they are moving at a fast pace and are trying their best to meet the October deadline.





Robbers strip trucks

An armed robber held a security guard up at gun point during a business robbery in Nettleton Road, Grootvaly Agricultural Holdings on Friday.

Two men confronted a security guard sitting in one of the trucks parked on the premises at about 12.45am.

The guard was held at gunpoint, before being tied up with shoelaces.

Springs police spokesman Capt Johannes Ramphora says the suspect informed the guard "we just want tyres".

One of the men, who was

armed with a firearm, stayed with the guard, while the other left.

"It was first suspected that there were only two suspects, but the guard says there were six in total," says Ramphora.

Police arrived on the scene and searched the premises.

They found that a propshaft from one of the trucks, 21 truck tyres and six truck batteries valued at R168 000, were missing.

The guard informed the police that the suspects only left the premises at 3am.

Police are investigating a business robbery case.

Murder in Skoonplaas

The body of a man was found by community members at the Skoonplaas informal settlement on Monday at 1.45am.

Capt Johannes Ramphora, spokesman for the Springs police, says community members were patrolling the area of the newly built shacks due to an increase in house break-ins.

"They heard a window

breaking nearby and went to investigate. When they inspected the shack, they found the deceased laying on the bed," says Ramphora.

The deceased had a stab

wound in his inner right thigh. The age of the deceased is unknown.

A case of murder has been opened at the Springs Police Station.

Hijackers claim Mercedes

Four hijackers took a Mercedes Benz C180 Compressor at gunpoint on Wednesday.

The incident took place at 11am, on the corner of Seventh Avenue and Ninth Street, in the CBD.

According to Capt Johannes Ramphora, the Springs police spokesman, a white VW Polo with four occupants blocked the driver's way.

Two of the passengers exited the vehicle, one pointed a firearm at the driver while the second suspect pulled him out of the vehicle.

Ramphora says the driver of the Mercedes, who was not the owner, says he was in possession of the vehicle because he had fixed the

bumper of his friend's Mercedes. The duo jumped into the

Mercedes and drove off, followed by the two suspects in the Polo.

No shots were fired. "We are investigating a hijacking case and urge the community to assist us in finding

the perpetrators," says Ramphora.

Asylum document taken in robbery

A tuck shop owner was confronted by the barrel of a gun when he was closing up shop in Slovo Park on Sunday at 8.30pm.

Capt Johannes Ramphora, spokesman for the Springs police, says the unknown man ordered the complainant to open the shop.

"The tuck shop owner said that the shop was closed and then noticed two more suspects, one of which was carrying a five-pound hammer

who started breaking the door," says Ramphora.

The owner was with two of his shop assistants when the suspects managed to break through the door.

"One of the assistants and the owner were shoved to the floor while the other assistant escaped through the back door.

"An armed suspect pointed a firearm at the owner and assistant while the other suspects scavenged the shop."

Cash to the amount of R3 000, airtime of R1 300, two cellphones as well as one asylum document were

"As the suspects left, the one armed with a firearm fired two shots just outside the door of the shop.

"Two cartridges were found four houses away from the shop."

The police are investigating a case of business robbery.

Business robbed of R200k worth of goods

A security guard at a company on Welgedacht Road, Springs, was confronted by three suspects at 8.30pm on Friday while he was alone in the guard

Capt Johannes Ramphora says one of the suspects pointed a firearm at the guard and took his cellphone.

"The three suspects took the guard to a container on site where they tied his hands and feet with rope. They left him inside the container with his face to the floor," says Ramphora.

The guard managed to lift his head and saw "a lot of legs" through the side of the container, claiming that there were between 15 and 20 suspects on the site.

"The suspect with the firearm kept watch over the guard while the rest were busy on site, asking him if there was a panic button - to which the guard replied 'no'."

He kept watch over the guard until 4.30am and then left the

The guard was tied up until 6am when the morning shift came on duty and released him.

Fourteen truck tyres were stolen from the trucks, two TLBs were emptied of diesel and a bar fridge and microwave were stolen from the premises.

The value of the goods stolen is estimated at R200 000.

No shots were fired and a case of business robbery is being investigated.

Metro fixing sewerage blockage in Nuffield

Metro contractors are currently working on the sewerage blockage in Jansen Road, Nuffield.

This comes after business owners in the area reported it to the metro numerous times.

Business owner Lindie Pietersen (30) claims the metro just never bothered to come out to investigate.

"The sewage leak starts at the top corner and flows right down to our business at the bottom.

"We cannot live or work with the stench any longer - the metro has got to do something about it," she

She claims the blocked sewerage pipe overflows for a few days and then the spillage suddenly stops.

To make life easier for themselves as well as their employees, business owners have sprinkled chlorine powder over the spilt sewage to try to dampen the smell.

But Pietersen says they can only do this when the sewerage pipe is not blocked.

"As soon as the sewage flows again, all the chlorine is washed away," she says.

Metro spokesman Themba Gadebe says the problem occurred due to a section of a sewerage pipe being broken.

"This causes regular blockages," he says.

Metro contractors removed the blockage last Thursday but the pipe became blocked up again during the night.

Gadebe claims the contractor was sent back to unblock the drain on Friday again.

The metro suspects that the line has collapsed further down.

"The contractor is busy opening up the pipe further down, towards the N17 highway, to expose the parts of the collapsed pipe that need to be replaced," says Gadebe.

The entire area will be cleaned up and disinfected once the pipe has been repaired and the area has dried out.

"We apologise for the inconvenience this has caused," says Gadebe.

Skoonplaas saga continue

Last Wednesday, Skoonplaas Informal Settlement was once again in the spotlight when the Red Ants Security Forces were seen demolishing empty and newly erected structures.

Members from the Springs police and the Ekurhuleni Metro Police Department were on scene to maintain law and order.

Lt Col Kobedi Mokheseng, EMPD spokesman, says the metro called the Red Ants for help to remove alleged illegal structures.

"Our job was only to look after the safety and security of the community," he says.

Ward councillor Ramesh Sheodin says the residents are trying to get an urgent interdict from the Gauteng High Court to prevent the removal of the structures.

"The EMPD and Gold One Modder East Operations are awaiting the outcome of the application," he says.

New Kleinfontein Goldmine (Pty) Ltd, trading as Gold One Modder East Operations, started leasing the property from Ekurhuleni Metro 11 years ago when the settlers were already on the property.

A "gentleman's agreement" between Gold One and the residents was reached that they could remain on the property, provided they don't build

any further structures or grow the number of residents in any way.

Sheodin claims there were only about 40 structures at the time of the "agreement", but in 2015 this number began to increase which led to Gold One handing out a court document (notice of motion) to the residents to inform them the structures would be removed from the property.

The application was heard in the Gauteng High Court on July 14, 2015.

The Red Ants were called in to remove all the structures which were erected in contravention of the court order.

The court ordered that the respondents are prohibited from selling any portion

of the property, erecting any further structures or encouraging or instigating any person to construct any structure, as well as removing all newly erected structures.

"However, this wasn't adhered to and pieces of land are still allegedly being sold for R2 000 for the building of shacks," he says.

says.

Skoonplaas residents, who wished not to be named, claim it is all about the illegal selling of land "which doesn't belong to the alleged sellers".

The chief operating officer of Gold One William Oasi, was not available for comment after numerous attempts to contact Gold One.

No plans for Frikkie Deysel Park

Etienne Fourie's efforts to transform Frikkie Deysel Park into a haven for animals and birds may not materialise.

He planned on transforming the park, situated on the corner of Sarel Cilliers Street and McClean Road, opposite Rus 'n Bietjie Old Age Home, into a wildlife sanctuary.

When he handed in a proposal to the metro's parks and recreation department in September, he expected cooperation from them.

Instead, he claims, his proposal was not even an option for discussion.

Fourie asked the metro for assistance with the cleaning of the existing pond and to erect a fence around the park.

"I didn't expect the metro to develop the park. All I asked for was [for them] to assist and maybe be joint partners in the transformation - the rest I would have done at my own expense," he says.

The dam is currently home to quite a large bird population which, Fourie feels, needs to be protected.

"Reeds have taken over the alleged wetland and I wonder if the metro has any plans to at

least maintain the pond," says Fourie.

According to metro spokesman Themba Gadebe, metro parks department manager Lindiwe Makubalo recently met with Fourie on site with personnel who deal with wetlands.

"These people indicated that the dam is a wetland

and Fourie was advised on which procedures to follow to ensure that his proposal gets attention."

Ward councillor Dean Stone is disappointed with the metro's decision not to upgrade the park.

Environmentalist Charl van der Merwe disagrees with the metro and says the pond is man-made and was designed for rehabilitation purposes.

"The pond was built to control the flow of storm water from the roads and was designed with a silt trap which used to be maintained in winter.

"If metro had maintained the silt trap, the pond wouldn't have silted up," says Van der Merwe.

No quick fix for Dam hyacinth

Following complaints about the hyacinth not being treated with herbicide in the Dersley dam, the metro has provided this comment:

Metro spokesman Themba Gadebe says metro officials have done some spraying, but herbicide spraying is more effective when it is carried out continuously without interruption.

"In this instance, the rain disrupted the programme in a significant way," he says.

He explains that the current hyacinth cover presents a challenge for spraying and reaching all the areas of the dam and it is not possible, in the current state, to launch boats and spray the entire dam.

The strategy in such situations is to combine herbicide spraying and physical removal.

"We are optimistic that with temperatures dropping and making use of physical removal we will be able to reclaim the dam in the next few months," he says.

This has been achieved in other lakes and dams which are far bigger than this dam.

"He says the public should understand there is no quick fix in managing hyacinth.

"However, we reassure the public that we will have sustained interventions to ensure the dam has a manageable hyacinth cover in the next six months or so," says Gadebe.

Residents talk to councillor

Welgedacht residents recently met with their ward councillor to find a solution to service delivery problems in the area.

This comes after more than 100 residents took to the streets in protest of their dissatisfaction with the metro's service delivery.

Community leaders met with Clr Dean Stone last Wednesday in what he refers to as a "fruitful" meeting.

At this meeting the community representatives handed over a memorandum to Stone which he handed over to council on Friday.

The memorandum includes the community's demands on service delivery and requests, including a robot, streetlights and the cutting of grass.

Community representative Kutlwano 'Strawberry' Ngema claims Stone informed them that everything including the budget, is out of his hands and in the hands of the mayor.

She gave feedback to the community on Sunday.

"More questions were asked and they raised uncertainties.

"We have given the metro 21 days to respond

to our demands," says Strawberry.

On the question of what will happen if their demands are not met, Strawberry commented: "we will cross that bridge when we get there".

She claims they have been without street lights for years and the request for a robot on the corner of Welgedacht Road and First Avenue has been ignored since 2015.

"With no parks where our children can play, neglected roads with potholes and a stadium which is not maintained, we need urgent assistance from the metro," she says.

Incorrect property details fixed

The metro has confirmed that they are aware of the incorrect information contained in some Section 49 letters issued in terms of the General Valuation Roll inspection process.

In a release sent out by spokesman Themba Gadebe, the metro has acknowledged property owners would have received letters from the city issued during February, calling for the inspection of the general valuation roll and lodging of objections as per section 49 of the Municipal Property Rates Act of 2004.

The letters have correct property owner information but the property description box and its contents are incorrect.

This was a result of an error when merging data to mail these letters.

The metro is preparing new letters with the correct property description and values and these will all be mailed before the end of March.

The certified valuation roll is, however, currently open for inspection at Customer Care Centres, as the certified roll remains intact despite the printing error on notices to inspect it.

The closing date for objections will be on May 5 at 3.30pm.

This still affords residents enough time to lodge objections (where applicable) in line with the relevant legislation.

The metro will also place the certified valuation roll on its website from today (Thursday).

Ekurhuleni East TVET College goes international

Ekurhuleni East TVET College (EEC) has been selected as one of two TVET Colleges in South Africa to run a Dual System Pilot Project (DSPP) for electrical and plumbing trades.

They will be guided by the German Association for International Cooperation (GIZ).

The college principal, Happy Sibande, says the new initiative was announced by a German parliamentarian Dr Thomas Feist, from Berlin, during his visit to the college.

"This initiative will be beneficial in ensuring that staff and students are better trained, in the workplace, for the workplace of the 21st century.

"This dual system apprenticeship

training model is new to South Africa but has already been applied with success in Germany.

"Under this system students spend up to 70% of their training period in the workplace itself.

"The theoretical training they receive at the college is continually reinforced with practical application in the workplace.

"Students alternate between the college and the workplace in block periods of between eight and 14 weeks throughout their training period," she says.

Happy says the TVET colleges can play an important role in addressing the skills shortage in South Africa.

"It is our vision that Ekurhuleni

East TVET College will be a world-class Technical Vocational Education and Training institution," she says.

Happy says that, together with five staff members, she undertook a study tour to Germany in January to learn more about the programme.

"The DSPP lecturers at the college will visit German institutions in May.

"This will lay the basis for student exchanges in the future," she says.

Happy adds that the programme could only succeed with the support and active participation of industry.

"It was therefore important that we nurture relationships, both internationally and with local industries," she says.

"People wore shamrocks on their coats and closed the day by "drowning the shamrock", placing it in a glass of whiskey before drinking," Cronin said. Gobs and gobs of Guinness

This Irish stout is the drink of choice on St

Patrick's Day.

Tips from Guinness on the perfect pour: Tilt the glass at 45 degrees when pouring until it is three-quarters full, and then let the beer settle before filling the glass completely to the top.

Analysts are predicting that 13 million pints of Guinness will be consumed worldwide, during this year's holiday.

Leprechauns

Veritas College Springs

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Today's leprechauns, usually rosy-cheeked, little men in green attire, come

from Irish folklore.

The first recorded mention of a leprechaun goes back to the eighth century, coming from the word luchorpán, meaning "little body" to describe water spirits.

Another possible origin is the Irish god Lugh, whose Welch variant is known as one of the "Three Golden Shoemakers.'

There's also the Irish fairy Cluricaune, "a cunning spirit who haunts cellars, drinks, smokes and plays tricks," the Matthewses write.

Cluricaune was popularised in a 1825 publication called Fairy Legends.

The drinking of green

In Ireland you would be hard pushed to find a pub that served green beer.

The actual fact is that this is not a typical tradition of Ireland but it is for the rest of the world.

Some places in Ireland, such as Dublin, may have a few pubs that will serve green beer but mostly it's not something they do.

Did you know that pubs in Ireland had to remain shut for St Patrick's Day?

It wasn't until the late 1970s the Irish law permitted pubs to open their doors on March 17.

Irish music

Music is often associated with St Patrick's Day and Irish culture in general.

From ancient days of the Celts, music has always been an important part of Irish life.

The Celts had an oral culture, where religion, legend and history were passed from one generation to the next by way of stories and songs.

After being conquered by the English, and forbidden to speak their own language, the Irish turned to music to help them remember important events and hold on to their heritage and

The Nowhere Man

A government has scoured unprincipled foster homes looking for orphans who have given up

It has spent years training them to become throw-away assassins who travel the world dispatching its enemies.

Inevitably the conscience, which it was thought had been obliterated, trickles through the orphans' consciousness and some of them try to stop what they are doing.

One result is Evan Smoak, and several others have managed to escape the programme.

Most have been obliterated by those who shaped them.


However, Evan has remained unscathed and uses his skill and unlimited wealth to respond to calls to his high-tech satellite phone from people in distress.

The idea might not be new (one hears whispers of the X-Men) but Hurwitz has skilfully managed to introduce a new character to the genre.

In this, the second Evan Smoak novel, Evan is captured drugged and transported to ... well, initially he thinks he is in Switzerland but soon changes his mind.

It is his wealth, not his expertise, which interests his captor who is not even aware of how dangerous Evan is.

At the back of his ageing kidnaper's mind is the need to fund an expensive lifestyle and, more importantly, a quest for youth that involves the transfusion of the blood of twenty-something party-goers into his own



Evan's main concern is to escape in time to help a young woman who has been sold and in days will fall into the hands of the man who purchased her.

Keeping him imprisoned in a luxurious room are cameras, regular doses of sleeping gas, a slew of hard men hired from a drug cartel, a giant, two snipers and a man who is desperate for Evan to sign off on a money transfer.

The government is also still on his trail. Suffice it to say reinforcements are needed. Hurwitz, a product of Harvard and Oxford,


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One solution to money management

The children of St Catherine's Nursery School are proud to support The Potters Haven.

Principal Susan Ramos says they ask the children to bring money to school every Wednesday and place it in glass bottles.

"Once the bottles are full we donate it to a charity of our choice," she says.

This time their charity of choice was The Potters Haven, a registered non-profit organisation in Struisbult.

Ramos says it teaches the children to care for others adding: "It would be wonderful if other schools would also collect for such a worthy cause."

Marlene Minnie, founder of The Potters Haven, says they appreciate the gesture.

The organisation provides a home for babies and children who have been abused and neglected and also for those who have HIV.

"Donations are appreciated and will be put to good use," says Marlene.

She treasures the words of one of the children saying: "She claims she had no money to give, but when her tooth comes out and the tooth fairy gives her money, she will donate it to the collection," says Marlene.

Gauteng needs more schools

The MEC of Education, Panyaza Lesufi, says they have identified the need for more schools in Gauteng.

He says that education plays an important role in preparing young people for post-school opportunities by providing key knowledge, competencies and skills.

"The admission challenges we faced has brought to our attention that there is a need for more schools and classrooms in Gauteng.

"Initial estimates indicate Gauteng requires 200 additional schools to deal with the historical backlog and meet new demands," he says

Lesufi says they have built 43 new schools since 2014 including new ICT-enabled classrooms in existing schools.

"This year, the department will open 13 new brick-and-mortar schools and build schools out of alternative construction technology (ACT) to alleviate admission pressure," he says.

Lesufi says that the roll-out of ICT (information and communications technology) in schools is well on track.

'The programme is biased towards township no-fee-paying schools as a way to manage redress but also positioning ICT as a game changer in education transformation.

"We are converting over 2 300 Grade 11 classrooms into smart classrooms in the current roll-out and 9 000 educators have been issued laptops as teaching resources.

"Over 60 000 learners in matric, in 377 township schools, are benefiting from ICT programmes.

"All grade 11 and 12 educators in ICTenabled schools were provided training to integrate ICT into education," he says.

Buying a property together

For many first-time home-buyers, the only way to get onto the property ladder is by doing it with a partner.

"If you take into account that the average monthly salary is R12 715 and that reports indicate that small properties were selling for around R867 014 in 2015, while averagesized properties were going for R1.3 million, you'll see that it's not financially viable for many South Africans to invest in property on their own," said Bruce Swain, MD of Leapfrog Property Group.

Take a property with an asking price of R1.2 million, where the buyer puts down a 10 per cent deposit of R120 000. A 90 per cent bond will amount to R1 080 000 and, assuming an interest rate of prime plus two per cent, the repayments will come to R12 144 per month - a sum clearly out of reach for the average salary earner. In addition, buyers will have other costs to budget for, including transfer duty and bond registration costs.

Benefits of shared home ownership

"It's generally recommended to save up a minimum of a 10 per cent deposit on a property. Naturally, combining resources makes it much easier to do so. Combining two salaries also improves applicants' chances of obtaining a home loan," explained Swain.

Sharing the property costs range further than the initial purchase of the home. It can include the monthly mortgage repayment, transfer duty, property taxes, municipal rates and future repairs to the dwelling.

Expect the best but plan for the worst The problems usually start when either party can no longer afford to contribute to the mortgage, and their partner is held liable for the full amount by the lender, or if one of the parties wants to sell their share of the property.

"Whether you're purchasing a property with your spouse, a relative or a friend, it's a really good idea to discuss the potential issues that might arise and to draw up a contract between the parties, before purchasing the property," advised Swain.

Ask questions about whether the property will be shared 50/50, and if not, how the funds, responsibility and eventual re-sale value will be affected.

According to Swain, other questions are:

- Who has the right to occupy the property? • Who is responsible for its maintenance?
- Does either partner have the right of first
- refusal if either party wants to sell?

 Can funds can be withdrawn from the bond? "It's essential that both partners agree on how they'll handle non-payment by either party as well and under which conditions the

partnership may be terminated.' Aside from the financial implications of investing together, it's also good to look at compatibility, how cleaning and grocery shopping will be handled and the like. Another element is the furniture and appliances - it might be easier for each partner to buy

certain items outright, which they can take with them if they choose to leave. Purchasing these items separately avoids disputes over the value of the article.

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
